

#### How to Help Your Rising First Grader

Kids develop skills at different rates.

There are things you can do at home to help prepare your child for first grade, too.

- Visit the library often to read or hear a storyteller. Check out books with classic tales, as well as new titles. Ask your librarian for help choosing quality literature. Role-play social situations.
- Play rhyming games and language play
  - Jump rope rhymes, silly songs, finger plays, and riddles. Talk about rhyming words and the rhythm and repetition you hear.
  - Letters and words are everywhere in your home, on the street, in the store, etc. Make it a fun learning game to play "I Spy" I spy with my little eye something that starts with the letter M or /m/ (the sound of m), depending on the developmental of your child.
- Play board games that build math skills.

Flash card bingo, Flash card addition and subtraction problems to 20

Use multisensory techniques to practice writing

For example: magnet letters, white boards, sand, flash cards, playdough

• Let your children see you writing: letters, checks to pay bills, the grocery list, anything! Give them their own paper, letting them write out their own lists using kid writing. It's all right if you cannot read it at this point, you are modeling for them uses and reasons for writing and reading, which is must more important at this stage.

### Kindergarten Academic Skills Students Should Master by the End of the Year

Reading
With prompting and support, identifies similarities and differences between two texts on
on the same topic.
With prompting and support, compare and contrast the adventures and experiences of characters in familiar stories.
With prompting and support, retells familiar stories, including key details, in sequential order.
In an emergent-reader text, can identify, blend, and read words.
Reads 100 common high-frequency words by sight (see list attached).
Language Arts
Uses a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose an opinion piece in which they tell the topic or name of the book and state an opinion about it.
Uses a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose informative texts in which they name what they are writing about and supply at least two details about the topic.
Math
Represents subtraction problems using objects, fingers, drawings, or acting out.
Uses subtraction within numbers to 10 to solve word problems.
Fluently subtracts within numbers 0-10 using objects or drawings.
Expresses the length of an object as a whole number of length units by using
non-standard units of measurement (Ex: paper clips, unifix cubes)
Describes measurable attributes of objects, such as length or weight.
Compares two objects to decide which object has more or less of a common attribute

and describes the difference (Ex: which is taller or shorter and why).
Identifies shapes as flat or solid.
Names, describes, and compares 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional shapes.
Science
Students will describe what plants and animals need.
Students will describe how plants and animals grow and change.
Describe the need for water and how to be safe around water.
Social Studies:
Recognizes that U.S. currency comes in different forms.
Identifies the differences between basic needs and wants.
Recognizes that people work to earn money to buy things they need or want.
