

Required Summer Reading for Rising 6th Graders

Dear 6th grade Student,

Advanced ELA students, select and read **TWO** fiction books (that you have not previously read), from the Summer Reading flyer provided. Regular ELA students, select and read **ONE** fiction book (that you have not previously read) from the Summer Reading flyer. The book(s) chosen should be within your current reading range. Advanced ELA students will complete the Bookmark Assignment for both books (in this packet and available to download on the school website). Regular ELA students will complete the Bookmark Assignment for one book (in this packet and available to download on the school website). Complete your planning sheet FIRST! Be sure to turn in the Planning sheet with the finished Bookmark!

For the Bookmark Assignment: Use the information on your planning sheet to create a bookmark about your book. Your bookmark should include:

- The title and author of the book.
- Summary of important events (the events that occur in the book) without giving away the ending.
- Characters list the main characters, their defining traits and conflicts they face.
- Setting Describe the setting of your book.
- Theme What was the theme of your book?
- Review How did the story make you feel? Did you enjoy it? Explain what you did/did not enjoy. Be specific with details about the plot, characters, setting and language of the book.
- Graphics Include a picture or image from the book that relates to the theme. The image can be clip art, hand drawn art, or an image cut from a magazine.

This assignment is due the second Friday of the 2018-2019 school year. Students also have the option to take the Accelerated Reader quiz on the book(s) chosen for this assignment. However, the quiz is NOT required and will not be a graded portion of this assignment. Any AR points earned will count for the 1st grading period. We hope to encourage reading for pleasure during the summer months.
